Additionally, UToledo offers residencies in dentistry and pediatric dentistry accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation (CODA).

The University of Toledo is a comprehensive, public research university. Established in 1872, the University offers over 270 undergraduate, graduate and professional programs in the arts, natural sciences, health sciences, education, engineering, business and law.

Students enjoy technologically advanced learning facilities on two campuses, historic Main Campus and Health Science Campus, as well as ancillary facilities to support research and scholarly activity that include the Lake Erie Center, the Stranahan Arboretum and the Frank Gehry-designed Center for Visual Arts at the Toledo Museum of Art.

Residents and fellows at UToledo have access to University programs and courses in a variety of areas including those toward completion of an advanced degree with 100% of the tuition waived. While each situation is influenced by specific resident/fellow circumstances, prior

educational background and specialty program requirements, current and former residents/fellows have been able to take advantage of this opportunity with some even earning a master of public health (M.P.H.) or a master of business administration (M.B.A.) while completing their residency or fellowship program. In addition, your eligible spouse and/or dependents are also eligible for the 100% tuition waiver if courses are taken for credit in completing a degree.

The size and scope of ProMedica Toledo Hospital has made it a destination for patients and provides you access to a growing volume of high-acuity cases across a broad range of sub-specialties throughout your training.

Since becoming partners, the College of Medicine and Life Sciences and ProMedica have worked to recruit new specialists, department chairs and researchers to Toledo. These faculty have joined the University because of the expanding opportunities to pursue discovery and provide leadership in a growing academic medical center.

A community-focused teaching hospital, we're building on a deep-rooted foundation of service and excellence in healthcare.

The University of Toledo Medical Center (UTMC) is located on The University of Toledo's Health Science Campus, home to both clinical operations as well as the University's graduate-level health programs, such as medicine, nursing, pharmacy and medical research operations. The 246-bed hospital serves the southwestern area of Toledo and the extended region and receives patients from rural hospitals for more advanced specialty treatment.

UTMC continues to serve as the region's only transplant hospital, with nationally recognized faculty who specialize in kidney transplantation.

The hospital has the region's first inpatient detox unit. In addition, UTMC provides inpatient child, adolescent and senior behavioral healthcare and a continuum of adult outpatient behavioral health treatment services.

UTMC recently invested in an expanded Comprehensive Care Center to provide connected primary care, including clinic space for family medicine, internal medicine, ob-gyn and geriatric care along with x-ray, laboratory and pharmacy services to encourage patient compliance with provider-prescribed treatment and better health outcomes.

Lloyd A. Jacobs Interprofessional Immersive Simulation Center

The Lloyd A. Jacobs Interprofessional Immersive Simulation Center on The University of Toledo Health Science Campus provides student, residents, fellows, faculty, practitioners and the community a place for hands-on clinical simulation and interdisciplinary team training in a low-risk environment where learners receive immediate feedback. The simulation center's mission is to advance interprofessional healthcare education and improve clinical outcomes through the development of clinical and professional competencies to enhance patient safety and satisfaction.

Interprofessional Education Program

Healthcare professionals from varying disciplines interact at the patient's bedside every day, so at The University of Toledo we prepare students from all health professions to interact with each other to provide patient care. Undergraduates, graduate and professional students work in teams to foster greater communication and respect, improve patient safety and encourage patients' engagement with their healthcare team.

The University of Toledo interprofessional education program includes students from across the University who are studying medicine, clinical psychology, nursing, occupational therapy, pharmacy, physical therapy, physician assistant, public health respiratory therapy, speech-language pathology and social work.

Research

Many residents choose to engage in scholarly activity throughout their training. Physician scientists may elect to participate in research and clinical trials. Thanks to an investment through the Academic Affiliation with ProMedica, the University has upgraded its research facilities with advanced technology to improve the speed and efficiency of testing outcomes. Residents also have the opportunity to participate in research projects in areas of quality improvement, patient safety and other aspects of outcome measurement.

UToledo faculty research work is nationally recognized and externally funded in areas of hypertension, precision medicine, the impact of microcystin on internal organ systems, cancer biology, interventional neurology and more.

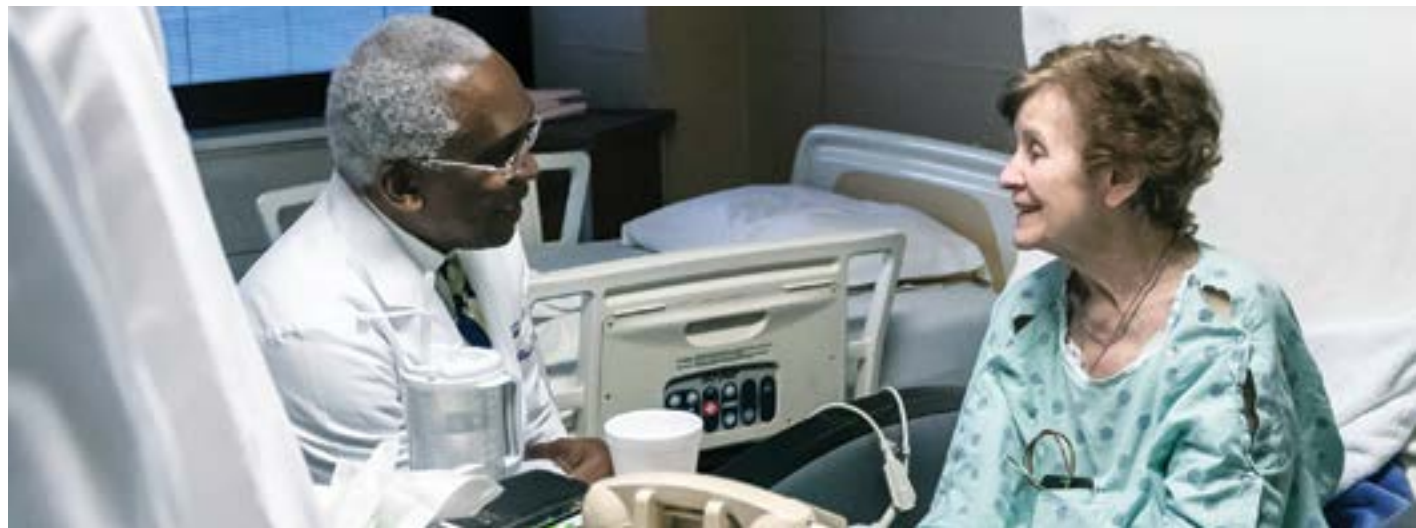
